Focal motor status epilepticus (FMSE) is repetitive and persistent myoclonic, clonic, or tonic contractions of the arm, face, or neck that can affect an entire side of the body, with or without alteration of mental functions.. I describe the case of a patient having focal motor status epilepticus (FMSE) associated with non-ketotic hyperglycemia (NKH). FMSE was initially controlled with short term anti-epileptic drugs and strict glucose control. FMSE with NKH is often associated with acute or remote symptomatic brain lesions.
