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CNS Demyelinating Disease

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CNS demyelinating disease is characterized by lesions that are associated with loss of myelin in brain, optic nerve or spinal cord. Usually, these are classified as multiple sclerosis (MS), neuromyelitis optica (NMO), acute disseminated encephalomyelitis, and acute and subacute necrotizing hemorrhagic encephalitis. Herein, we discuss the current concept, diagnostic criteria, clinical, laboratory, radiological features with therapeutics in these disorders.
